Indeed We have created man from an extract of clay, then placed him as drop of semen in a firm resting place, Then changed the semen into a leechlike mass, then the leechlike mass into a fetus lump, then the fetus lump into bones, then clothed the bones with flesh, and then We brought him forth as quite a different creature from the embryo-so blessed is Allah, the Best of all creators. (Quran 23:12-14),

Which were not scientifically understood until the advent of modern embryology.
